- Charlotte Hall Veterans Home is a program under the Maryland State Department of Veterans Affairs- George W. Owings, III, was appointed by Governor Hogan to serve as Secretary in February 2015
 - Opened in 1985- Celebrating 33 years of "Serving Those Who Served"
 - US Dept. of Veterans Affairs funding through a grant program called "State Veteran Home and Construction Grant Program" 65% US Dept. of Veterans Affairs funding- 35% State of Maryland Funding
 - 286 Skilled Nursing Beds + 168 Assisted Living Beds =454 total beds

- 2018 Average Occupancy: 90%
- September 1- September 30, 2018: 9 Admissions, 4 Discharges, 12 expired=(-7 net from August)
- 36% of population are between the ages of 80-89
- Population includes 13 female veterans & 29 female spouses
- 82% of veteran population served during war time
- 48% of veteran population served in the U.S. Army
- Distinguished Medal Recipients:
 - 4 Legion of Merit
 - 16 Bronze Star
 - 9 Purple Heart
 - 2 Former POW

How is Charlotte Hall Veterans Home different than other nursing home facilities or assisted living facilities?

- Charlotte Hall Veterans Home serves veterans and their eligible spouses
- On-Site Medical Services: Attending Physicians, Nursing Practitioners, Dental, Optometry, Podiatry, Physical Therapy, Occupational Therapy, and Speech Therapy
- On-Site Pharmacy, Pharmacist and Pharm Techs
- On-Site Barber and Beauty Shop
- On-Site Massage Therapy/Pain Management Practitioner
- On-Site Veterans Service Officer- Certified by US Dept. of Veterans Affairs
- Robust Volunteer Program- Over 22,000 hours recorded last year
- More affordable- current USDVA Per Diem Rates:
 - \$107.16 per day for Nursing Home Care=\$3,214.80 per month savings
 - \$46.25 per day for Assistant Living Care=\$1,387.50 per month savings
 - A VP1- 70% or greater Service Connected Veteran may be entitled to the full cost of nursing home care.
